AN INTERVIEW WITH TAMMY STANDLEY

“I started my training as a technical official back in 1999 when I began work for what was at that time WAHA, as Competitions Manager. From there I went on to work for Hockey Australia for three years from 2005 - 2007 where I had the opportunity to work alongside some of the top Technical Officials in the world. I was fortunate that after leaving Hockey Australia and noting my desire to further pursue my officiating career, I was given a number of Oceania appointments as a Judge and then TO. This led to my appointment to the FIH Panel where I am now a Level 3 Technical Official. I have had the opportunity to perform all three technical Roles at an International Level and am always learning and growing within the position I am appointed.”

The use of technology by both teams and officials has changed significantly. Computers on the technical table make it much easier to complete the match report. Video footage of matches to review incidents on the pitch after the match.

Advice to those aspiring in this field?

AN INTERVIEW WITH JOANNE GREENSILL

“I started mentoring/assessing umpires in my early 20s and before commencing a technical career in earnest I had the role as UM and UC at many HQ State Championship. I was awarded my Australian Umpiring Badge in 2000 along with my Level 1 technical. I was approached to consider moving to technical side of officiating and from there completed my HA Level 2 technical qualification. I TD'd my first HA tournament in 2011. In 2015 I was given the opportunity to attend my first offshore international appointment in Durban, South Africa as a Judge and following a couple more tournaments I achieved my FIH Level 5 Technical. In 2017 I was appointed to my first international TD role which was followed by my FIH upgrade to a Level 3 Technical Official and appointment to the 2018 Commonwealth Games.”

I have been very passionate about hockey since I first picked up a stick and I have made fabulous lifelong friends. Officiating allows me to give back to a sport that has given me so much.”

How has the officiating space changed over your time?

Absolutely - the support and professionalism of officiating has come leaps and bounds since I umpired my first national championship. Technical still has some way to go to keep up with the other aspects of our game and I look forward to seeing that happen.

Advice to those aspiring in this field?

It provides a fantastic opportunity to see a different side of our game and provide a safe and fair environment for our players and umpires.

Where/when can people find you at hockey these days?

I no longer play or umpire due to injury, but can be found at HA and HQ tournaments and the odd BWAHA game still mentoring umpires.

Do you contribute to the development or identification of officials on a State, National or International level?

As Chair of the HQ Technical Officiating Committee this is one of my most important roles. Ensuring we have a solid development program to both progress and identify technical officials.
